From the Vicarage

Dear Friends,

As I said in my letter last month, Easter Sunday is very late this year, falling on the 24th of this month. It can only ever be later than this by one day; some of you will remember Easter Day on 25th April 1943, and others can look forward to Easter Day on 25th April 2038! (Dates courtesy of the Internet; which has its uses sometimes!) Perhaps one day the Christian churches may agree on a fixed date for Easter, possibly the first Sunday of April, but until that time we have a range of dates from the 23rd March to the 25th April.

You may have heard the expression 'Better late than never!' and that may well be the right attitude for us to have as we prepare to celebrate the great Christian festival of Easter later this month. Think how different life would be for us if the story of Jesus had ended with his death and burial. On a trivial level, what year would we be in? If there had been no resurrection of Jesus, the Christian faith would never have achieved the impact that it has had over the years, so there would have been no call to number our years BC (Before Christ) or AD (Anno Domini- the Year of the Lord).

More seriously, if Jesus had never been raised from the dead, the event that we celebrate each Easter Sunday, then there would have been no Christian faith at all. His disciples might have kept his memory alive for a few years, and some of the wonderful stories and teaching that Jesus gave might have been recorded for future generations, but they would probably have faded into obscurity over the years, and if Jesus were remembered at all it would be only as a wise teacher, or possibly a failed Messiah.

Instead, the resurrection of Jesus transformed everything for the early disciples; they changed from a despairing group into a confident one, and once they had received the gift of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost, the church grew in numbers and influence as it has continued to do from that time until this.

This year, we shall be celebrating Easter on the day after St. George's Day (23rd April). George is rather an obscure figure, even though he is patron saint of several countries as well as England. The best-known story about him is his slaying of the dragon, an event that is probably more myth than truth. (Have you ever seen a dragon?) But that story, and the closeness this year of his day to Easter Sunday made me think that another benefit of Jesus' resurrection is that he has slain the dragon of death for us. Of course, Christians die just as everyone has to die sometime, and we know the sadness that death can bring. But one of the joys of Christian faith is that we no longer have to fear death as something uncertain and hugely powerful. When Jesus was raised from the dead, he opened the way to eternal life for all who believe in him. As one of the great Easter hymns puts it:

'Jesus lives! Thy terrors now
can no more, O death appal us!'

We can rejoice in the great hope that God gives us because Jesus has been raised.

So a late Easter to celebrate, and you will find details of the Holy Week and Easter Services elsewhere in this magazine. I hope that when Easter Day dawns on the 24th, you will be filled with joy and will want to praise God for the great hope he has given us through Jesus.



News from St Bartholomew's School ...

We took part in the Jump for Dance Festival at Buxton Opera House along with Flash and Hollinsclough schools on Monday 14th February. The children performed a lovely dance routine after practising each week with Sharon Spooner. 14 school took part in all and our children did us all proud. They all fully enjoyed the experience. The children performed the routine again at the Leek gym and dance festival on 14th March.

Mrs Evans has had a lot to tell the children about her recent educational reciprocal visit to Kenya. Cluster "It was a very eye opening and humbling experience to work in school where the children were taught in their third language (English), many in classes of over 100 and with only one teacher with a blackboard. In many schools there was not even electricity. All the children and teachers I met were so warm and welcoming and so desperate to educate their way out of poverty. They achieve so much with so little resources. Over the year we are working on joint projects of weather, growing and festivals with our Kenyan school so our children can learn from each other. A truly life changing experience and I can't wait to go back."

All our children are taking part in Africa Day at Manifold School with the other cluster schools on Wednesday 23rd March where we shall each be presenting some themed work, experiencing African drumming, story telling, music, drama, handling artefacts and creating art work.

All the children and staff came to school dressed in red with red noses for Red Nose Day. Our cook Miss Vickie made and sold

red nose day cakes at 50p each, the children brought in jokes for a joke book which we sold at a £1.00 each and the children and staff paid £1 or more for wearing red for the day. We raised in excess of £50.00.

We have been awarded a long awaited Lottery grant to refurbish the school hall to encourage further community use. Work should be starting on this very soon.

Please note - the school runs a designated nursery provision with free places for 3 year olds. It opens 5 mornings a week and is staffed by well qualified Early Years Practitioners. In conjunction with this we have a pre school playgroup on site which will offer places for children from 18 months onwards, which will be open 5 full days from 9.15 till 3pm after Easter. Ofsted have judged both to provide at least good with some outstanding provision. Visitors are always welcome. Please contact school for an appointment.

Who was St George?

News from Hollinsclough School
Our "Flexi School Learning Hub", (the aim of which is to help facilitate a relationship between the school, parents who choose to home educate their children, and the children themselves) is proving to be very popular. The Learning Hub is open every other Friday between 10am and noon (dates coming up are 1st April and then 6th May due to Easter). For families with children attending Little Berries pre-school, or registered to attend the main school, there is no charge for access and for those who are not registered there is a nominal charge per family per session to cover costs of sundry items used.

Our successful dance event with Longnor and Flash schools at Buxton Opera House last month was followed this month by a further all day dance event. This took place on Monday 14th March at Leek High

School. Again the children performed brilliantly in front of a large audience, and were very well behaved throughout the visit - they were good ambassadors for the school.

Our work with our Creative Partner Sue Lawty is going very well. The children have worked together to decide how to utilise an area of outdoor space, and we have been planting willow to start to create a tunnel with pathway to an integral roundhouse. Very many thanks to the parents and others who have assisted both with their time and materials/tools etc. We need much more "stuff" to help complete this, and so the children have been practicing their persuasive writing skills to ask local quarries, timber merchants, garden centres etc to help us out if they can, by donating some of the materials that we will need. On 2nd March children from St Thomas Moore school joined us for a very interesting and successful "Biodiversity" day where we looked at the diversity of life in the Peak District National Park and on their second visit on 16th March they helped with our Outdoor Project.

This month Central ITV visited and filmed at our school which was very exciting for the children.

Our work on our topic of "Time" is continuing and the children have made clocks this month, which are on display at the school entrance. They are all keeping time very well and the designs are fabulous - we have cows, flowers, a castle and a couple which have a "striking" resemblance to Big Ben!

On Shrove Tuesday the children made (and enjoyed!) pancakes, and we looked at this tradition around the world.

We will be going to Manifold School on 23rd March for an African Day where we will take part in activities such as stories, drama, drumming, art, an african meal and the children will deliver a presentation about childrens rights.

The school will be taking part in a swimming gala on 6th April at Waterhouses with Flash and Longnor. The aim is to promote and enhance the school's swimming programme.

Also on 6th April we have a live music performance in school from a four-piece band including percussion, brass and woodwind. They will perform popular and classical music with World War II songs.

On Thursday lunchtimes the children have started some tennis coaching and this will continue until the end of the summer term.

Little Berries is our pre-school provision, offering a fun, relaxed and positive environment for the little learners. Little Berries is available during term time on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays 9am - 1pm for ages 2+. Please ring 01298 83303 if you would like more details.



